List High School and Community Honors and Activities

During my years in high school my academics have been something I am very proud of. I have made the 4.0 honor all four years and my overall weighted GPA is 4.23 with my current GPA being a 4.6. Up to this point I have been in fourteen concurrent enrollment courses achieving A's in ninety percent of them, and B's in the other ten percent. I currently hold ninth place out of one hundred and five people in my class. During these years I have been involved in clubs such as cross country, girls' soccer, FFA, National Honor Society, and 4-H. I was inducted into

NHS at the end of my sophomore year, and by the end of my junior year I was nominated and inducted as the Vice President. Once my senior year started, I ended up stepping into the President's role as needed. While in this club I helped organize both food and blood drives while doing my best to lead my peers to success. This past fall was my second year being on the cross-country team and I was named captain by both my team and my coach. I will be on the girls' soccer team for the fourth year in a row once the season starts this spring. I have been named co-captain by coaches for this season. I participated in FFA for three years and during that time I made it to the state level in agricultural sales as well as quiz bowl. I also participated in animal science, floriculture, and creed speaking. During my final year I was given the state degree award. I was a member of 4-H for nine years. In this time, I held many offices such as club President (x2) and Secretary. I also became our County Council's Secretary and at the same time I was nominated and voted in as the District Vice President. I was also awarded a leadership award four times. During my time at the county fair I won Grand Champion Market Goat, Grand Champion Market Beef (x2), Grand Champion overall Beef Showman, Grand/Reserve Senior Beef Showman (x4), Grand Champion Senior Goat Showman, and I placed in the top five for Senior Swine Showman. During my time in 4-H and NHS I contributed to over fifty community service hours. These hours included activities such as trash clean up, preparing and sending out baked goods to first responders and teachers, writing holiday cards to nursing homes, and much more. This past Fall I obtained my CNA certification through Pueblo Community College, and I am currently working as a CNA for Hospice of Montezuma. My past employment includes being a teen leader for the Dare to Be You program. I am very proud of all that I have accomplished, and I plan to continue it during my collegiate years as I pursue my nursing degree.

When I think about my future, I think about success. I envision myself as a pediatric nurse travelling between hospitals in order to help as many children as possible. As a highschooler I am taking as many college classes as I can in order to get a head start on my bachelor's in science of nursing. I have taken fourteen college classes thus far including the one I am currently in. For the majority of my career as a Registered Nurse, I hope to work in a pediatric unit as it

will be what I specialize in when I start the process of getting my master's degree. By the time I am thirty I will have my master's degree in science in Nursing in Pediatric Primary Care, this will prepare me for taking care of children from the time they are born until they are in young adulthood. I am choosing to work in pediatrics because I adore children and I believe I would thrive in this kind of environment. Being able to babysit the young children I do provides me with a sense of pride that no other job could. I have always felt that I have been called to help people in any way that I can, and being able to work with children and infants is a task I will be honored to do. I know I can make a difference in the lives of the children and families I will help, but in order to achieve this I know I have many challenges to overcome, and a lot to learn. 
