I was also a player on the volleyball team, and coached a local youth volleyball club 13u team for their season! Academically, I made the Deans List last semester and was awarded for my academic achievements. As a member of the volleyball team, I was involved in various volunteer endeavors such as hosting and running volleyball tournaments for youth players and participating in "Bison Buddies," a weekly visit to a local elementary school to interact and role model for kids in the Shawnee community.

Essay

My name is Shelby Jabour, and I am soon to be a junior at Oklahoma Baptist University. In January of 2025 I transferred to OBU from Graceland University, which I attended for 3 semesters from 2023-2024. With my degree and intended career path, I will be able to affect a broad pool of clients from athletes to recovering trauma patients and anything in between. To help myself succeed, I am doing my best to stay out of debt paying for college, intending to start building my career right after graduation. I would also like to lessen financial stress on my family as much as possible as well as my younger sister, soon to be a senior in high school, also has aspirations to attend college. Knowing the financial strain of having just one child in college, I am looking to do anything I can to cut into university bills alternative ways like Empire Continuing Education scholarship. I am also in a particular situation as I have a food allergy which has exempted me from eating in the cafeteria to avoid cross contamination. This now puts the financial strain on me to provide my own food for each meal of the day. While this is a better alternative to eating potentially contaminated food, it does add some more financial burden to me to have to pay for my meals on a regular basis. From January Term 1989 to Summer 2004, an initial grade of D or F was deleted from g.p.a. calculation if the course was repeated at OBU. Subsequent repeats or repeats of C grade or above, all grades were included in the g.p.a. calculation. Beginning Fall 2004, only the last grade earned is calculated in the g.p.a. if the course is taken at OBU.
