List Your School and Community Honors and Activities

My volunteer work and contributions to my local community include several organizations related to youth sports. For the last several years, I have volunteered for The 12 Hours of Mesa Verde, which is an endurance mountain bike race that is one hundred percent volunteer-run. This organization donates over \$70,000 annually to local youth programs and organizations that support at-risk teens. I've spent many summers assisting Cortez BMX, which is our local-sanctioned BMX race track. I raced BMX my entire childhood, so contributing to this volunteer-run organization and helping other kids have the same great experience I did is significant to me. I've helped run youth basketball camps related to our basketball program, teaching kids valuable life and basketball skills. Three years ago, in order to support elementary basketball athletes, I created my own free youth basketball camp with my teammate, which we called Hoopsters. This camp was completely designed, organized, and implemented by my teammate and me, and it allowed me to work one-on-one with students to develop their individual fundamental basketball skills in our after-school program. I've also helped Mancos Elementary School with their "Fun in the Sun", which is an activity that celebrates the last day of school through games and athletic activities. My role was to help the 5th grade students set up, manage, coordinate, and oversee the "Fun in the Sun" games for everyone in the school, kindergarten through fourth grade. In addition, because track is another passion of mine, I've volunteered at Mancos Middle School track meets for several years, making sure the high jump event ran smoothly while helping kids prepare for their other events.

Mancos High School Class of 2025 Valedictorian:

I received this award during my high school graduation for having the highest cumulative GPA in my class.

Academic All-State First Team:

This award is given to athletes who maintain a 3.5 or higher GPA during their sport, and I was presented with this award because I maintained a 4.0 GPA during my athletics.
